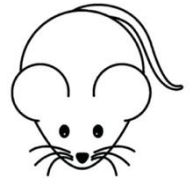


I'm a *Responding Raccoon* and I just want a quick response. **Do poets, like Frederick, work?**

What is work?

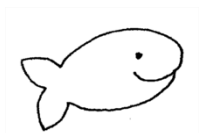


Think about these different activities and see you can fit them into the table below.

6. Copying recipes from your Gran to write a baking a book



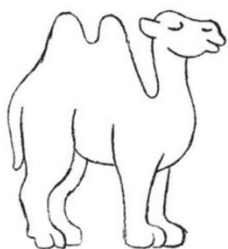
